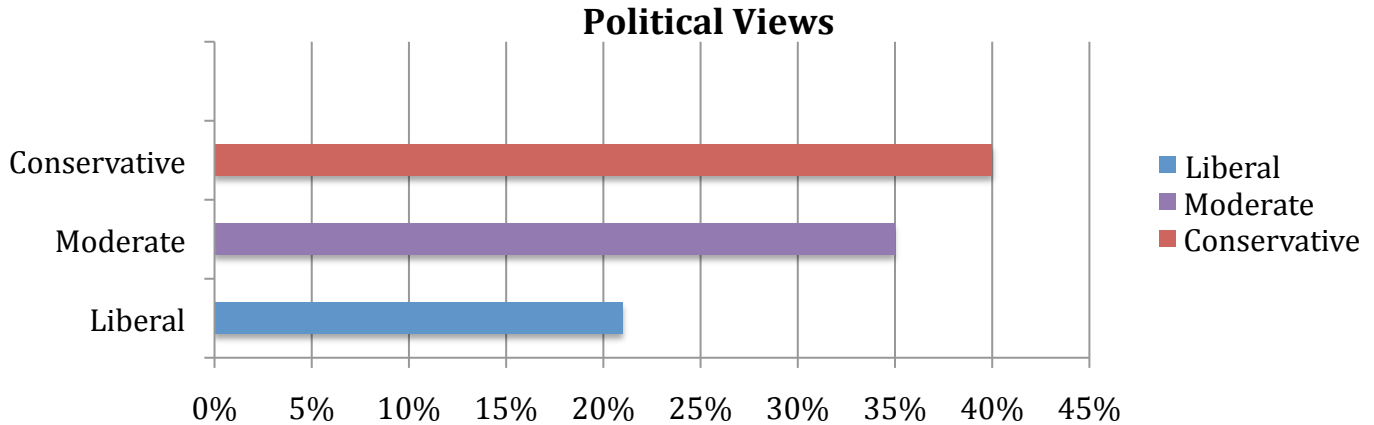

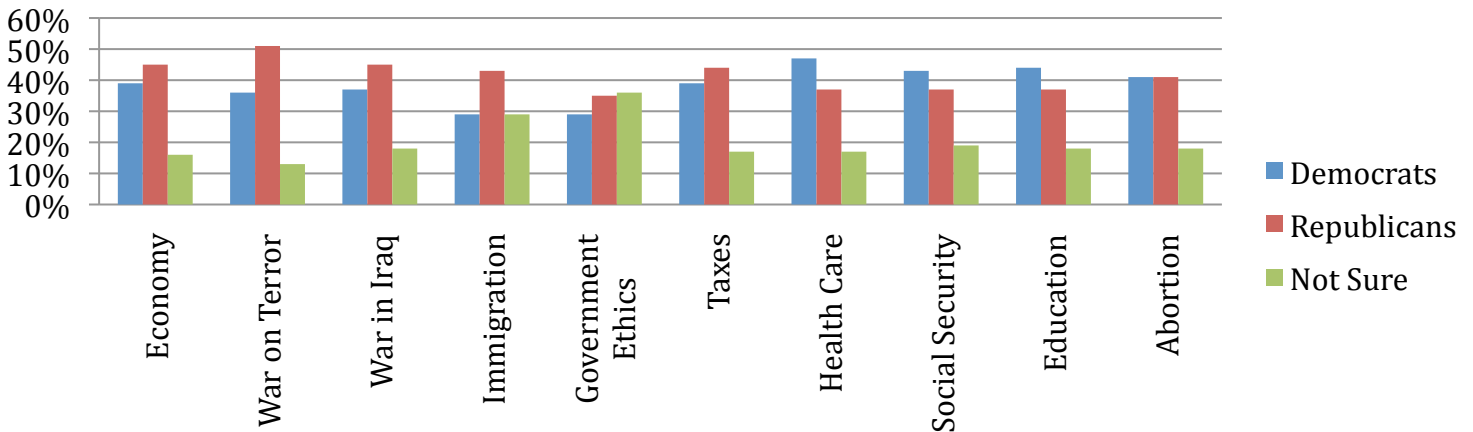
Overlooked Recent Polling And Insights • June 18, 2009

More Americans Are Conservative Than Liberal: A June 15 Gallup Poll found more Americans today describe themselves as conservative rather liberal or moderate. In surveys taken from January to May, Gallup found that 40% of Americans identify their political views as conservative, 35% as moderate and only 21% as liberal.

In the same vein, a June 8 Rasmussen Poll found voters trust Republicans over Democrats on key issues, most importantly on the economy, taxes and national security. Voters said they have more trust in Republicans to handle six out of ten issues discussed. These results come at a time when Americans appear to be growing frustrated or discouraged with Obama's policies, especially on the economy and deficits.
